








El Pozo De Vida is a NGO that fights against human trafficking in Mexico and Central America. We are committed to the prevention, intervention, and restoration of children, families, and communities who are vulnerable to this crime, so that they can experience freedom and a fresh start in life.

We currently have 9 projects that allow us to have influence on a national level in Mexico, as well as to be references on a continental level; we form part of the Regional Coalition against Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling in Latin America and the Caribbean.

A MESSAGERS FROMOURFOUNDERS

Our word for this past year has been "expansion." We truly saw this word fulfilled as we experienced growth in several areas. Our safe house has doubled its number of girls and women by taking on more complicated cases. A whole new project was created to reach the male population in the red-light district. Our prevention team has traveled all over Mexico to raise awareness about the realities of human trafficking in schools and businesses. Our immmigration project has also expanded its reach by visiting several new detention centers. We held our first Justice School 5.24 in Mexico City. We've also increased our involvement in the governmental sector as we contributed to the legislation that prohibited child marriage in Mexico. Since then, we have also initiated dialogue to end child forced begging. Overall we had 50,000 people benefit from our projects in 2019.


This coming year marks El Pozo de Vida's 10th anniversary and we are going for more. We want to increase our influence to share all of our God-given insight and experience with the rest of the world.

By 2021, El Pozo De Vida aims to expand our impact by achieving four main goals:

- 1 Create a specific and holistic life plan for our beneficiaries. This allows physical and spiritual healing, as well as emotional, psychological, legal, and financial stability to help them successfully reintegrate back into society.
- 2 Raise awareness about human trafficking and its dangers and consequences among local families and communities. By converting them into strategic allies we can prevent the consumption, discrimination, and re-victimization of survivors, while promoting a culture of freedom, equality, and non-violence.
- 3 Assist Mexico in reforming their judicial system to better prosecute, hold trials and ultimately convict those guilty of this crime, providing justice for survivors and ensuring their restoration and social reintegration.
- 4 Provide continuous internal training to maintain a healthy environment and transform our staff into experts and consultants to combat human trafficking.



Since 2018, we have been specialized consultants for the Regional Coalition against Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling in Latin America and the Caribbean.



The Justice School 5.24 is a three-week intensive training program that provides anti-trafficking workers with a holistic skill set needed to develop specialized programs in the prevention, intervention, and restoration of victims and survivors of human trafficking. This training was possible through the efforts of 27 Million and El Pozo de Vida.

Increase our impact

HOW EFIGHT FOR FREEDOM

We help our beneficiaries regain their reedom and equality because we've developed a unique, integral stategy based upon three key approaches:

1. Prevention

Prevention of human trafficking and associated violence with vulnerable populations.

2. Intervention

Intervention in situations of human trafficking in vulnerable communities to reduce the harm and contribute to restoration.

3. Restoration

Restoration of survivors through our holistic care model.

LIVRE raises awareness of human trafficking and combats it through informative campaigns that target vulnerable populations. This prevents new victims and discourages demand for prostitution. LIVRE foters activism and social movement workshops in schools, transforming communities from within by promoting equality and freedom, and spreading a message of change without violence.


Achievement: Trained and mobilized key community agents and partners to fight against this crime.

Overall: \$31,115 USD
Cost per beneficiary: \$0.80 USD





Dreams is a program that detects and supports victims of human trafficking and child sexual abuse within immigration detention centers and migrant houses in Central America. We educate adults on their increased vulnerability to human trafficking and how they can avoid becoming victims. Through art therapy, we guide them in processing their journey and their trauma, allowing them to look to the future with hope. We carefully address the subject of abuse with children, using stories, games and activities designed to teach them how to speak out loud and prevent it in their own lives.


Achievement: Established a more stable relationship with the National Institute of Immigration which has enabled us to continue our activities with more ease.



Goal: Replicate our program in the northern and southern border of Mexico in Tijuana and Tapachula.



Overall: \$22.116 USD Cost per beneficiary: \$2.81 USD





HOME focuses on the male population to combat the issues of machismo, gender violence, the demand for prostitution, and toxic masculinity. We intervene in communities by giving workshops to confront stereotypes and gender roles, along with cultural, social, and religious paradigms, to offer a new definition of masculinity.


Achievement: the recipients have built a network of friendship and community, which is the precursor to establishing the project's values within their circles of influence.



Goal: Acquire our own space that is comfortable and welcoming where we can offer therapy and get-togethers, as well as classes, talks, and workshops.



Overall: \$20,283 USD Cost per beneficiary: \$21 USD



Dunamis is our community center located in the heart of Merced, the targest red-light district in Latin America. We provide a safe place for women working in prostitution who have a very high probability of being victims of human trafficking. Through workshops, therapy, spiritual guidance, tutoring, and a free meal center, our staff builds relationships with these women to become a support network while offering them a way out of prostitution.

Once a month we go to the red-light districts of Mexico City to throw a **Block Party** for women in prostitution. Our goal is to disrupt the current system of the commercial sex industry by creating a new atmosphere of hope and love. We work to build relationships with these women, showing them they are seen and valued, and offering them our support in whatever they need, including a way out of prostitution. We also reach out to the men who are clients to dialogue and show the love they are often looking for.



Our **Safe House** is a place for minors who have been victims of human trafficking. They receive holistic care trhough education, individual and family therapy, spiritual counseling, medical attention, legal counsel, and job skills. We walk them through our individualized restoration program focused on healing and building resilience to thrive in their reintegration to society.

Average length of stay can vary from a few months up to 6 years depending on the case, with an ideal length of 3 years.




Achievement: We had a 60% increase in our number of recipients.

Overall: \$144,292 USD Cost per beneficiaryt: \$480 USD





Transition Home is our program for women coming out of Safe House, employing a similar model to that of a halfway house. They receive financial and social support as they pursue their dreams by continuing their education and learning to manage the joys and trials of their societal reintegration. As in the Safe House, they continue to receive therapy, spiritual counseling, medical attention, legal counsel, and job training to help them word towards independence.

Sahl+1 is our culinary arts training program that uses the cooking essentials of salt (Sal), water (Agua), flour (Harina) and yeast (Levadura), to bring transformation, one person at a time. Vulnerable pasts are converted into empowering testimonies through education and mentorship that instills universal skills and entrepreneurship for a sustainable income.
